





Latin America and the Caribbean are set to see a 269% rise in the number of people facing severe food insecurity bringing the total to 16 million people not knowing where their next meal is coming from in coming months, up from 4.3 million in 2019.

The relentless rise of hunger, struggling economies, deepening inequality and an active hurricane season are threatening the people of Latin America and the Caribbean and may have far-reaching consequences unless swift action is taken, warns the United Nations World Food Programme (WFP).

As coronavirus cases soar, Latin America has become the region most impacted by COVID-19 globally, accounting for over a quarter of the world's cases. Ministry of Labor & Labor Development (Mitradel) Forecasts At Least 386 Thousand Panamian Layoffs At The End Of 2020 (25% Unemployment)

It is estimated that more than 300 thousand Panamanians will be unemployed at the end of 2020.

With 25% unemployment, estimates the Ministry of Labor and Labor Development (Mitradel), close 2020, as a result of the crisis due to COVID-19, compared to 2019, which closed with 7%.

The figure is extremely alarming, taking into consideration that before the pandemic there were more than 100,000 unemployed in the country, and with the pandemic, the statistics indicate that more than 300,000 people will be added to the unemployment list.

In elementary school about 10% of the students are lost; in pre-media, the net enrollment rate falls and it is estimated that 39% is lost; in high school the net enrollment rate of 52%, which means that half of those who started primary school are lost. Regarding the university career, Castrellón said that Panama is the fourth country in desertion at that level and 40% of students are lost. It highlights that the educational issue is an impact issue because it has **health repercussions** (malnutrition), informality, open unemployment, and the probability of economic and social insertion.

On the other hand, 3,000 teachers have not been connected to distance classes for their students to continue education.
